Language Arts / Reading

Reading in the middle school is taught through a literature based curriculum. Literary analysis terms are taught through the reading and discussion of the novel, short story, nonfiction, poetry, and stories from the oral tradition. English includes a study of vocabulary, a grammatical review, and writing using the Empowering Writers method. Research is taught through a weekly class with the librarian.

Students in all grades use the Saxon math program. This excellent series allows the student to master new skills while continually reinforcing skills acquired in previous lessons and grades. Two levels of instruction are offered at all three middle school grade levels, including Algebra I for qualified eighth grade students.
